Getting to the Conference

By air

The best way to get to Utrecht by air is to travel to Amsterdam. Schiphol Airport is the main airport of The Netherlands: most major airlines have it as their destination. Within Europe, budget airlines also fly to Eindhoven and Maastricht. From there, you can take a train to Utrecht Central Station. Eindhoven Airport is an hour by train and Maastricht about 2 hours.

From Schiphol Airport to Utrecht: The best way to travel from Schiphol Airport to Utrecht is by train. Tickets can be purchased from the ticket office or vending machines at Schiphol Station. Please be advised that, in the Netherlands, return tickets are valid for one day only. Trains from Schiphol to Utrecht are direct trains. They leave every half an hour (0.14 and 0.44). Travel time is 30 minutes. The entire trip (one way) costs € 7.60 (second class) or € 12.90 (first class). For information on departure and arrival times, platform numbers, international train connections and trains in other directions within The Netherlands, please visit www.ns.nl.

by taxi: Taxis leave at Schiphol Plaza, which is directly behind the departure-halls.

by car: you can rent a car at Schiphol Plaza, which is directly behind the departure-halls.

By train

International trains arrive at both Amsterdam Central Station and Utrecht Central Station. From Amsterdam Central Station, many trains go to Utrecht Central Station.

By car

Utrecht is a busy city in the center of the Netherlands. From all directions, highways lead to Utrecht. Please note that traffic can be quite heavy.

TRAVELLING WITHIN UTRECHT

By foot. The train station, conference-site, and inner-city hotels are all within walking distance.

By bike. Travel the Dutch way and rent a bike! At Utrecht Central Station: Catharijnesingel 34. In the city: Nobelstraat 293.

By bus. Bus route 2, departing from the central railway station, calls at Dom square. Bus routes 3, 5, 9 and 11 call at Janskerkhof. It is only a few minutes walk to the Dom square from here. You can also walk directly from the central railway station to the Academiegebouw (University Hall). This takes approximately 15 minutes.

By taxi. Taxis are easily available throughout the city. Note that taxis have a fixed fare in The Netherlands (a meter with a base tariff).

The Editor is seeking to augment the international pool of academic and professional associates in response to the increasing diversity of submissions (geographically, by discipline, topic and so on). We are keen to include additional AME members in the review process, especially since the JME forms part of the AME subscription. Junior scholars may also see this as a way of gaining expertise in the publication process. There is no payment for the work. Referees' reports are sent anonymously to the article submitter.
