Papers are invited for the 39th annual conference of the Association for Moral Education. Submissions are welcome from scholars across the many disciplines that contribute to the study and practice of moral education and development, including psychology, education, philosophy, sociology, criminology, cultural and childhood studies. We encourage individuals to submit proposals that address the theme, although conference submissions may be on any topic related to moral education, development, philosophy, theory or practice. AME always presents a variety of research and theory on moral development, moral philosophy, and moral education across all life stages and social contexts.

All proposals must be submitted online via the <u>conference website</u> by Monday 15 April 2013. Proposals received after this date cannot be assured full consideration.

Contributions may take one of four forms:

Paper presentations. Individual proposals that will be grouped thematically by the Program Committee for 75-minute sessions. Three papers will be chosen for each such session. The Program Committee will assign a chair for these sessions.

Paper symposia. Symposium proposals, like paper sessions, will normally include 3 to 4 presentations slotted into a 75-minute session. Symposia are organized thematically by the symposium chair who is also typically the organizer. Discussants are optional but discouraged if it significantly reduces interactions with audience members, and especially if the symposium has 4 speakers.

Poster presentations. Details regarding poster size will be posted on the conference website. Poster panels and adhesive materials are provided.

Pre-conference workshops. Workshops offer an interactive environment to explore issues in greater depth. Topics might include issues related to assessment, the enhancement of teaching and learning, a review of current work in an area of moral education and development research, or an exploration of varying points of view on a chosen theme. The workshops will be held on the morning of Thursday October 24 and will typically last 3 to 4 hours. Detailed submission information

All proposals must include the following information and should be organized using these section headings:

- 1. Full name, title and affiliation of the **first author and up to 3 additional authors or contributors**, along with a complete mailing address, contact information, and primary discipline for each.
- 2. Title of proposal
- 3. **Preferred format** for presentation (paper, symposium, poster or pre-conference workshop)
- 4. 100-word abstract
- 5. **Three keywords** to index the presentation
- 6. A **300- to 500-word summary** of your proposal. For symposia submissions, a 500-word (maximum) summary of each individual paper presentation along with a 250-word rationale for the symposium as a whole.
- 7. A brief **attestation** that if the proposal is accepted the submitter agrees to attend the conference.

Submissions must be in English and be in .doc or .docx format. The first author will receive acknowledgement of a submission via email. All proposals will be reviewed by members of the AME Executive Board and Officers, as well as appointed members of the Association. The Program Committee plans to notify first authors of its decision by mid June.

For presentation purposes, projectors and screens, but not computers, will be available in all conference rooms.
